Community Outreach Scholarship, Sponsored by Area Christian Churches

Various outreach ministries in greater Williamsburg have provided full or partial scholarships to students who desire a Christian education, have financial need, and who would otherwise be unable to attend WCA. The ministry determines the parameters of the scholarship, typically designating a set amount per month to offset the student's tuition cost. The student's family is also eligible to apply for WCA financial aid, and must pay some portion of the tuition as a family.

The Dick Woodward Agape Scholarship Fund

The Agape Scholarship Fund supports students who are challenged with various learning differences and limitations, and provides financial assistance to parents who cannot afford the help their children desperately need.

This fund is named in honor of longtime local Pastor Dick Woodward, founder of Virginia Beach Community Chapel and Williamsburg Community Chapel, and author of the Mini Bible College, an international Bible study curriculum that reaches audiences around the world through daily radio broadcasts and online lessons.

As a child, Dick Woodward struggled with a "learning disability" and, looking back, wishes that he had received individualized instruction that would have addressed his learning differences and helped him avoid related emotional and behavioral problems. Dick later became a husband, father and grandfather, and is now a bedfast quadriplegic due to a rare degenerative disease of the spinal cord. He knows first-hand how tough it is to deal with what are typically labeled as "disabilities," and has strong convictions about helping children who face physical or learning challenges.

WCA offers the specialized instruction and Christ-centered love that Dick believes can make a dramatic difference in the life of a child. He encourages our community to support the Dick Woodward Agape Scholarship Fund in order to make these valuable resources available to those who may otherwise not receive them.
